

### DAYTIME REGULATIONS

As a resident guest, you can fish in the lakes at De Schatberg with a Schatberg fishing licence. Because other activities also take place on the lakes, some regulations apply:

1. Fishing is allowed from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m. (assembly and packing included). For night fishing, the agreements on the next page apply.
2. For the 'nursery pond' and the connecting channel to the big lake, fishing is not allowed. This is to avoid disturbing the spawning area.
3. When fishing, you must always be able to show your fishing licence together with the park pass when requested by the inspectors, staff or management of De Schatberg, and instructions must be followed.
4. Keep your fishing spot clean and take everything back with you.
5. It is not allowed to consume alcohol or other refreshments in glassware around the ponds.
6. It is not allowed to park motorised vehicles such as cars, golf carts, quads, trikes and scooters at the lakes.
7. Fishing with white maggots is allowed. Coloured (red) maggots are prohibited. Due to the acidification of the water, feeding should be minimised: max. 2 kilos for carp anglers and max. 500 grams for whitefish anglers.
8. Fishing with 2 rods is allowed. The angler must be present at the rods. Getting coffee or the like means hauling in lines.
9. Fishing with fixed rods is allowed everywhere except along the water ski track during operating hours.
10. Only pike or zander meeting the size requirements may be taken. All other fish should be handled with care and returned as soon as possible.
11. Live nets, traps, cross nets and drift nets are not allowed on the fishing site.
12. Unhooking mats are desirable and compulsory for carp fishing.
13. The use of boilie boats, rubber boats, radio-controlled boats etc. are not allowed along and on the fishing water (unless otherwise specified, see points 16 and 17 on the next page).
14. Fishing without a licence will be fined with €20,00. Repetition will lead to a total ban on fishing and possible further measures by the management of De Schatberg.
15. For visitors, day passes are available at the reception desk. These day passes must be obtained by guests staying at the park and not by the visitor himself. They should bring a park pass. They should also be present together with the visitor when fishing. The cost for a day pass is €2,50.



# FISHING REGULATIONS

## NIGHTTIME

### NIGHTTIME REGULATIONS

Night fishing is allowed from 6 p.m. until 10 a.m. the next morning. This includes setting up and taking down the carp tent and leaving the fishing place clean. When fishing competitions are scheduled, the time for clearing the sites will be indicated.

#### 1 SEPTEMBER TO 30 APRIL

- 16.** Night fishing is allowed from 1 September to 30 April on Friday evening to Saturday morning on both the small lake and the big lake.

During these months, boilies may be taken out on the large lake on the side of the roadway except during school holidays.

Only sail forward and not in a V-shape so others have no fishing opportunity.

#### 1 MAY TO 31 AUGUST

- 17.** Night fishing is permitted during the period from 1 May to 31 August on the days listed below, under the conditions indicated.

##### Small lake:

- Monday evening to Tuesday morning
- Friday evening to Saturday morning

##### Big lake:

- Monday evening to Tuesday morning
- Wednesday eve to Thursday morning
- Friday evening to Saturday morning

- 18.** On both the small and big lake, it is not allowed to set up tents before 6 p.m. They must also be taken down by 10 a.m. the following day.

### ATTENTION!

If the water ski track is open between 9 a.m. and 10 p.m., signalled by a flag, no casting is allowed along the stretch of the water ski track. However, it is allowed to use a bait- and/or boilie boat along the stretch of the water ski track during night fishing.
